Coastal Cambodia

THE kingdom of Cambodia is benefitting from three decades of relative stability under Prime Minister Hun Sen after recovering from the brutal regime of the Khmer Rouge. Tourism is now growing by about 15% year-on-year. Since May 2010's foreign-ownership property laws, the country's appeal to overseas buyers has grown. 'Cambodia is an exciting new residential market, which is opening up,' says Rob Green of Sphere Estates. 'The first major luxury resort was Song Saa, offering a mix of island and overwater villas, and the residences, sold on long leaseholds, are now completely sold out.' Sphere Estates is launching Alila Villas, on the picturesque island of Koh Russey, which is a 15-minute speedboat ride from Sihanoukville town. The contemporary one, two- and four-bedroom villas are sold on 99-year leases with prices starting from \$550,000 (£382,000) (020–3617 1360; www.sphereestates.com).
